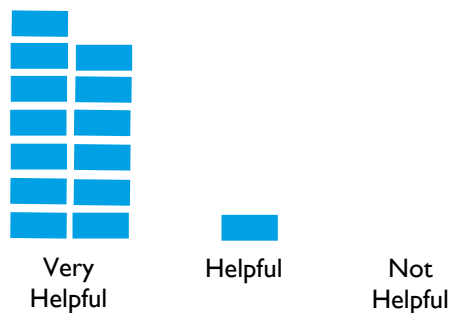

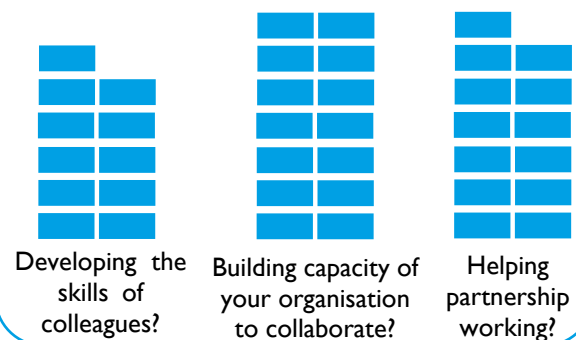

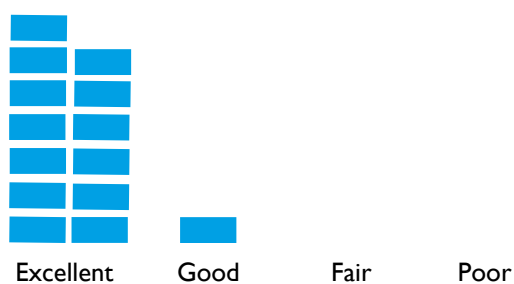
How helpful do you feel the 40 tools, techniques and templates will be to your work?



How relevant do you feel this seminar and book could be to:



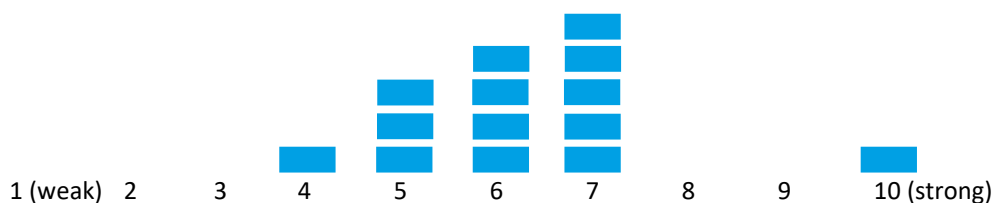
How would you rate the tutors?

Understanding the purpose and nature of this seminar

The seminar was developed from research work by Shared Service Architecture Ltd and Canterbury Christ Church University (CCCU) into the skills and knowledge required by public sector managers who will lead on shared service or collaboration projects.

Over 2000 senior leaders and managers from across the public and education sectors, especially local authorities, police, fire, further education and higher education, have attended at least one module in the Shared Service Architect's programme.

Many have gone on to complete the three seminars in the programme to become recognised Shared Service, or Collaborative Transformation, Practitioners and Architects and subsequently completed the Postgraduate Certificate in Collaborative Transformation and became recognised Shared Service, or Collaborative Transformation, Architects.

The style of the seminar was a mix of teaching input, discussion and action learning.
