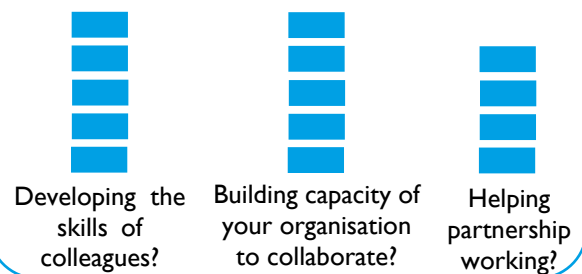
## Who attended?
