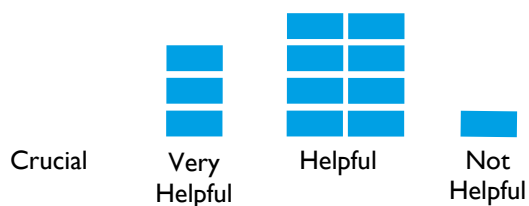

## Who attended?

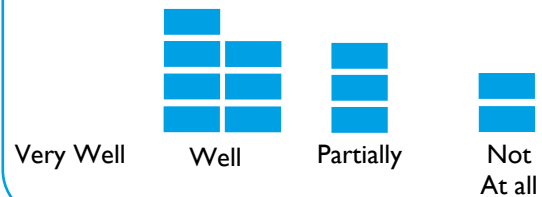
- 14 delegates from Hardwick CCG area

How helpful do you feel this session would be for other general practitioners seeking to explore new models of working collaboratively with others?



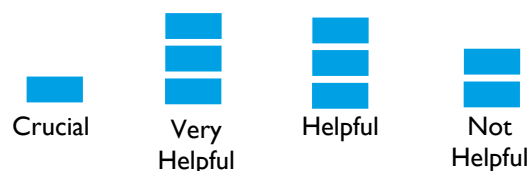
Two delegates did not answer the question

## Feedback from delegates that will enable SSA to improve the quality of future seminars

### What positive messages will you take away from today's seminar?

1. That there are many benefits to federating & it's the only way + we are to position ourselves in the right place for the future
2. The roles and responsibilities of each practices in the provider organisation
3. We are all experiencing similar concerns
4. Willingness to work collaboratively exists within Hardwick
5. Possibility
6. That the CCG are still thinking too far in advance rather than concentrating on the help needed presently. I do understand the need for this but this could be wasting resources/time should any more practices fail
7. It's about the relationships!
8. That ownership is less important to GPs than clinical autonomy and ability to lead (not employ) a local MDT
9. Good relationships & mutual objectives between practices
