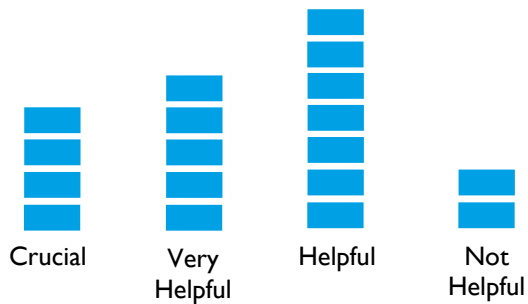

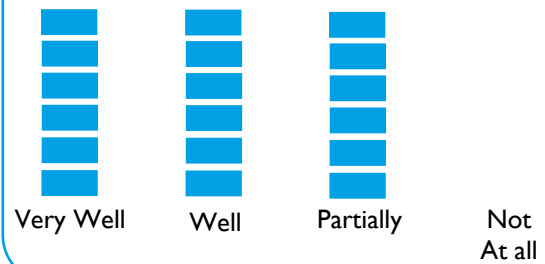
Who attended?
